 in the Town of Chester in Thent County <sup>of</sup> on the third Tuesday of  
 March next to answer unto such matters and things as shall be Objected  
 against her On Suspicion of Felony and if that in the meantime she shall  
 not be of good behaviour And now at this Day to wit the twenty first day  
 of March in the Year <sup>of</sup> last mentioned the said Isabella having  
 appeared the said Samuel Cook and Arthur Miller their Recognizance  
 are Discharged
