On of Back of y^e preceding Judgment was as fol^low^s viz^t Francis Colman
And the said James in his prop^y person Conoth and saith that he is
in no sort guilty of the promises above upon him imposed as by the said
Judgment is alleged and thereupon he putteth himself upon the
Country James Watson in f. f. f. f. f.

And he also followeth for the Lord prop^y in the manner saith he is guilty
Francis of Lord prop^y

And the said James Watson afterwards to wit the day and year aforesaid came into
Court and relinquishes his plea and saith that he cannot gainway the
Judgment and so as aforesaid against him brought nor can he say but that
he is guilty of the promises above upon him imposed as by the said
Judgment it is alleged and thereupon submits to the Court

Therefore it is considered by the Justices here this twenty fifth day
of March Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and twenty seven that
said James Watson pay the sum of one hundred pounds of Tob^o
as a fine for his aforesaid offence of committing an assault and battery
in form aforesaid and also that he pay the sum of four hundred and
thirty five pounds of Tobacco Costs according to the promises aforesaid
officers of this Court James Smith

Ordered by the Court here that the Sher^o of that County keep him till
James Watson in safe Custody until he shall satisfy y^e fine and costs
in the Judgment aforesaid amounting to five hundred and thirty five
pounds of Tob^o
