 Mary Wilson } Honourable the Lord Proprietor that now is  
 for the body of Trent County a<sup>d</sup> upon their  
 Oath do present that Mary Wilson of Saint Pauls Parish in  
 Trent County a<sup>d</sup> the wife of John Wilson of <sup>the</sup> County Subholder  
 the tenth Day of November Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> seventeen hundred <sup>and</sup> twenty  
 seven at the parish a<sup>d</sup> in the County a<sup>d</sup> within the Jurisdiction  
 of this Court in and upon a certain Henry Cully in the presence  
 of God and of the said Lord Proprietor then and there being with  
 force and arms an assault did make and him the said Henry  
 then and there did beat wound and lilly Treat so that of his  
 Life it was much dispaired and other harms to him then  
 and there did to the great damage of the said Henry and  
 contrary to the peace of the said Lord Proprietor that now is his  
 good Rule and Government
