And she the said Mary Sparowman in her proper person comes and saith that she is in no sort guilty of the premises above upon her Imposed as by the said Indictment it is alleged and thereof she putteth herself upon the Country —

Mary Sparowman Jura Jfona

And she the said Sarah Frenn atty of the ^{said} Lord Proprietor cometh and saith that forasmuch as he hath not Evidence sufficient to maintain the said Charge in the Indictment aforesaid against the said Mary Sparowman he will not prosecute the same Indictment any further — Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here sit at the Court house in the Town of Charles in Kent County of this twenty first day of November Anno Domini seventeen hundred twenty and seven that the said Mary Sparowman as to the Indictment aforesaid go thereof without Day and be therefrom acquitted Also it is Considered that the said Mary Sparowman pay the sum of three hundred and eighty nine pounds of Tobacco Costs accruing on the premises aforesaid to the Officers of this Court
