A Noli prosequi being produced from his Excellency the
 Governour the Court thereupon orders all proceedings hereon
 to cease and the Noli prosequi to be entered which is as follows

To the Worshipfull Justices of Kent County —

Whereas I am informed by Coll: St. Leger Codd of your County
 that he is apprehensive there may be a prosecution against him
 in your County Court for Incontinently Living with a certain
 Jane Tennard and whereas I am given to understand that the
 prosecution is contrived and Carried on by a troublesome Cozen
 more out of prejudice and Malice to him than any regard to the
 Law, and altho the said persons may be able to acquit themselves
 of the accusation yet there will be a charge. I do therefore here by order
 you that immediately upon a return of a presentment or Information
 or any other means of prosecution for that fact against the above-
 said persons or either of them that you stop any further proceed-
 ings therein and enter a Noli prosequi thereon for all which this
 shall be your Warrant given under my hand and Seal this
 11th day of November 1727 —
