John ~~Wilson~~ afterwards to wit the same Day and Year aforesaid Comers into Court and Relinquishes his plea and Aids saith that he Cannot Gain say the premises aforesaid upon him Imposed And Acknowledges himself guilty of the Assault and Battery aforesaid as by the aforesaid Information it is alleged and thereupon Submits to the Court

Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here this seventeenth Day of November Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and twenty four that the sd. John Wilson pay to the Right Honourable the Lord Prop. of this Province the Sum of two hundred Pounds of Tobacco as a fine for his aforesaid offence of Committing a Assault & Battery in form aforesaid and also that the sd. John pay the Sum of two hundred and three Pounds of Tob. Costs Accruing on the said aforesaid to the officers of this Court

The sd. John Wilson his Recognizance taken last Court in the Sum of ten Pounds Current money of Maryland to be levied &c. for the use of his Lordship the Lord Prop. of this Province his heirs &c. Conditionally that if he and his wife should not appear at this Court to Answer to his Lordship for a Assault & Battery And that if in the mean time they should not be of good Behaviour And now at this Court the sd. John having appeared as aforesaid and no Cause being Shown to the contrary the Recognizance as to himself is Discharged but it being made appear to the Court that his wife is in no sort Capable of appearing by reason of her not being well & aforesaid Recognizance as to her is Continued till Next Court

Maurice Carly and Thomas Mahawer both of Kent County Planters had ^{by them} into Recognizance at last Court in the Sum of five Pounds Current money of Maryland each to be levied &c. for the use of his Lordship the Lord Prop. of this Province his heirs &c. Conditionally that if the sd. John Wilson and Mary his wife should not appear at the then next Court to Answer to his Lordship for a Assault & Battery And if that in the meantime they should not be of Good Behaviour And now at this Court the sd. John having appeared as aforesaid and no Cause being Shown to the contrary the sd. Maurice & Thomas their Recognizances And either of them are Discharged As to the sd. John but it being made ^{appear} to the Court that the sd. John's wife is in no sort Capable of appearing by reason of her not being well their aforesaid Recognizance as to her is Continued till next Court
