met His Lordship Patrick Mackreel of Kent County Shoemaker as Surety for the said Ann Mackreel on the twentyeth Day of November Anno Domini Seven teen hundred and twenty four did Acknowledge himself Indebted unto the Right Honourable the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this Province of Maryland in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling money of Great Britain to be made & payed of his goods & Chattels &c. Conditionally that if the said Ann Mackreel should not make her personal appearance before the Justices of our Hon<sup>o</sup> Court to be hold for the County afo<sup>o</sup> there to stand and abide the Determination of the same Court and if that in the mean Time she the same Ann should not be of good Behaviour wherewith the said Patrick did Acknowledge himself Content

And now to wit at this Court being the sixteenth Day of May Anno Domini Seven teen hundred and twenty four the said Ann Mackreel not having appeared to the Recognizance as afo<sup>o</sup> Therefore it is Considered by the Justices here to wit at the Court house in the Town of Chester in the City this sixteenth Day of May Anno Domini Seven teen hundred and twenty four that the said Recognizance of the said Patrick Mackreel as Surety for his wife Ann Mackreel for the sum of twenty pounds Sterling money of Great Britain beforfoited to us of the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this Province of Maryland & that his s<sup>d</sup> Lordship have thereof Execution against the said Patrick Mackreel also it is Considered that the said Patrick pay the sum of twenty four pounds of Tob<sup>o</sup> Co<sup>o</sup> Accruing on the Sum<sup>o</sup> afo<sup>o</sup> by Court of this Court
