Thereupon Jacob Ashley of Kent County Planter present herein Court in his proper person Doth Acknowledge himself Indebted unto the Right Honourable the Lord prop. of this province of Maryland in the Sum of forty pound Sterling money of Great Britain to be made & Levied of his Goods and Chattels Lands & Tenements for the use of ^{the} said Lord prop. by his heirs and Successors Conditionally that if the same Jacob shall not make his personal appearance before the Justices ~~the Justices~~ of the next Court to be hold for the County aforesaid at the Court house in the Town of Chester in ^{the} same County on the third Tuesday of June next ensuing to answer unto an Indictment found against him for felony And if that in the meantime he shall not be of good behaviour wherewith the said Jacob Doth Acknowledge himself to be content
