Lord Prop. of this Province of Maryland in the Sum of ten pounds Sterling money to be Leased of their several goods & Chattels to y^e use of the said Lord Prop. by his heirs & Successors Conditionally that if the said Maurice Carby should not make his personal appearance before the Justices of this Court at any time during the same now sitting to Answer unto what should be objected against him on Suspicion of Breaking the Sabbath Day and if that in y^e mean time he y^e said Maurice should not be of good Behaviour and y^e said Maurice having appeared according to their Recognizance as aforesaid the same is Discharged

Ordered by the Court here that y^e said Maurice Carby enter into Recognizance for his appearance at next Court to Answer unto a presentment found against him by the Grand Jury for Breaking y^e Sabbath Day and y^e good Behaviour
