Baltemere, and his heires, or by his or their Deputies, Lievtenants, Iudges, Iustices, Magistrates, Officers, and Ministers to be ordained or appointed, according to the Tenor, and true intention of these Presents: And likewise to appoint and establish any Judges and Justices, Magistrates and Officers what loever, at sea and Land, for what causes soever, and with what power soever, and in such forme, as to the said now Lord Balsemore, or his heires, shall sceme most convenient: Also to remit, release, pardon, and abolish, whether before Iudgement, or after, all crimes or offences what soever, against the said Lawes: and to doe all and every other thing or things, which unto the compleate establishment of Iustice, unto Courts, Prætories, and Tribunals, formes of Iudicature and maners of proceeding, do belong: although in these Presents, expressemention be not made thereof, and by Judges by them delegated, to award Processe, hold Pleas, and determine in all the said Courts and Tribunalls, all actions. suits, and causes what soever, as well criminall as civill, personall, reall, mixt, and prætoriall, which laws, so as aforsaid to be published, Our pleasure is, and so Wee enioyne, require, and command, shall be most absolute and available in Law, and that all the Leige people, and subjects of Vs, Our Heires and Succesfors, do observe and keepe the same inviolably, in
