On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act investing the justices of the levy courts of the several counties in this state with further powers. ORDERED, That Mr. Emerson, Mr. O. Williams and Mr. T. Dorsey, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Emerson, from the committee, delivers to the speaker the said bill ; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill to lay out and make public a road therein mentioned in Harford county, was read the second time and passed.

Mr. Welch, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Anne Terry, of Kent county ; which was read the first and second time by especial order and passed.

A petition from Jonathan Edwards and Gilbert Middleton, praying they may have the benefit of an act of insolvency without obtaining the assent of their creditors, was preferred, read, and referred to Mr. Steuart, Mr. T. Dorsey and Mr. Little, to consider and report thereon.
