Mr. Ennalls, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. J. H. Thomas, from the committee, delivers to the speaker a bill, entitled, An act to regulate the fecs of the register of the court of chancery; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
