

This Indenture made this twenty second of August in the year of
 Our Lord one thousand five hundred eighty and seven,
 Between Phillip Conner and Mary his wife of the County of
 Kent in the province of mary land of the partie and Thomas Smyth of
 same County and province of the other partie witnesseth that he Phillip
 Conner for and in consideration of sume of six thousand pounds of londes or
 to have in hand by his self thomas Smyth all and before his deceallung and
 Delivery of these plants his Receipt whereof he say Phillip Conner doth
 hereby acknowledge Confess & declare and entry part of parcell thereof
 doth hereby clearly & absolutely require Exoneration & discharge of thomas
 Smyth his heires Executors & Cestals of duty of them or either by these plants
 and for divers other good Considerations have by his self Phillip Conner thereunto
 especially mouing him by Phillip Conner by his selfe consent and approbation
 of his wife Mary Conner his wife testefie by her being made party to these
 plants and signing & sealing of his same hath given grante Bargained sold
 Alened Entreated and Confirmed by these plants doth fully trothly &
 absolutely give grant Bargaine sell alien Entreaty and Confirm unto th.
 Thomas Smyth his heires and assigns for ever all that parcell or tract
 of Land called trumplington lying on the East side of Chesepeake Bay in Kent County
 being part of a Devident of Land formerly belonging to Mr. Thomas West and
 recovered from him by the south to Anthony Purse and John Hynkynge part therin
 purchased by Mr. Nathaniel Goffs being two hundred acres as by a bill of
 sale from the south both appear a bushell part of mth house bounded therin
 by to Phillip & Mary Conner. The warrant by which she was Smyth &
 his heires to have together w^t all rights profits & benefits thererof belonging
 and alse all paynes Penalties & Evidence touching or any rife infamy same
 have and to hold by the pece of Land & Bargained purched by th^r Thomas Smyth
 his heires and assigns for ever by Phillip Conner and Mary his wife to th^r Thomas
 Smyth his heires & assigns for ever to have and to hold the same
 said Thomas Smyth his heires and assigns that they it to Phillip Conner &
 Mary his wife their heires Execut^rs and Cestals of the tract of land to him by
 Thomas Smyth his heires or assigns against all & every manner of perjuries &
 wharrours shall and will after warrant of dated by these present testaments
 and services hereafter to become due by the same to be paid or payed by the said
 and further that they had Phillip Conner and Mary his wife have
 hoys and assignes shall and will from hence to byme and all his heires
 during the space of seuen years all & Requer & all & change & discrete in all
 of him by th^r Thomas Smyth his heires or assigns made done by him
 execute and suffer or cause to be made to one. I herby acknowledge Entreated and
 suffered all and Every such further & other act or acts to be done by me
 or my heires abundance or abudance & requisites in the p[ro]p[ri]ety of land
 confirmed & more here Making of these Bargaines & to be unto him
 by th^r Thomas Smyth his heires or assigns for ever. But if it so chanceth
 of y^r masteres ffeue & ffreight or other wife or by any such birth or accident
 as by him by th^r Thomas Smyth his heires or assigns or by himselfe
 q^r son shall bee Reasonable & justly aduised or required to give or reme
 y^r Phillip Conner & Mary his wife for her service full and plenteous
 of day & yere a true condition.
