

This Indenture made this thirtieth
 day of Sept^r and in the year of our Lord god one thousand
 five hundred and ninety and in the third year of the reign
 of our sovereigne Lord and Lady King William & Queen
 Mary betwixen Thomas Ringold of the one part and
 Michall Miller of the same county and province of the
 other part. **Witnesseth** y^t the sayd Thomas
 Ringold for the sum of Ten thousand pounds of law
 under taken and bound to be well and truly pay by the sayd
 Michall Miller to the sayd Thomas Ringold att or
 before the enjoining and delivery of these presents y^t
 receipt whereof y^e sayd Thomas Ringold doth her by auctor
 ity of the King and for divers others good causes and considerations
 him the sayd Thomas Ringold therunto especially moving hath
 given granted Bargained sold allience assigned & conveyed
 unto y^e sayd Michall Miller his heirs and assigns for ever
 A certain well or tract of Land situate and lying
 on Kent Island and on the Western side of the sayd Island
 beginning att the mouth of Crany Creek and rising
 alonge the Bay side South unto the land of the sayd
 Michall Miller wh^{ch} he bought of John Ellis and lies
 along Ellis his Lyn: East to the main Road thence North
 to y^e Land called Crany thence west to the Bay side
 w^{ch} Crany Creek containing and now layd out for
 one hundred acres more or less called by the name
 of Crayford w^{ch} for Bargained & assigned together
 wth all wood, Underwood, water water courses, Rights
 privileges, tenents, commodities, Hereditament and an
 appurtenances what forever to the sayd Bargained & assigned
 w^{ch} belonging or in anywise appertaining and all the right
 right & Interest claim & demand what forever of
 him the sayd Thomas Ringold of in and to the sayd Bar
 gained & assigned and all Patents, Letters, Grants
 miniments and writings touching or concerning
 the sayd Bargained & assigned together wth hereditament
 or appurtenances, or mainor or remainder
