

This Indenture made this tenth day of October <sup>344</sup> 1755 <sup>in the second</sup>  
year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord & Lady <sup>Wm &</sup>  
Mary King & Queen of England Scotland France and  
Ireland Defenders of the Faith & in y<sup>e</sup> year of our  
Lord Christ one thousand six hundred & ninety Between  
Lot Christ one thousand six hundred & ninety Between  
Benjamin Blacklock & Hannah his wife of the one part  
and Thomas Joss of Kent County Inholder of y<sup>e</sup> other  
part Witnesseth that y<sup>e</sup> Benjamin Blacklock  
for & in consideration of y<sup>e</sup> sum of of ten thousand five  
hundred pounds of t<sup>o</sup> to him in hand paid as or before  
the enfolding & delivery of these presents by y<sup>e</sup> Thomas  
Joss the receipt whereof y<sup>e</sup> Benjamin & Hannah his  
wife doth hereby acknowledge and also for divers other  
causes them therunto moving Have given granted bar=  
=ganted aliened sold outsold & confirmed and by these  
presents doth fully clearly & absolutely give grant bar=  
=ganted alien outsell & confirm unto y<sup>e</sup> Thomas Joss  
his heirs & assigns for ever all that meadow or t<sup>o</sup>ment  
with the Land therunto belonging situate lying & be=  
=ing in Kent County & commonly called or known by the  
name of provocation of all conveniences: situate lying  
and being between Grays End Brook & Casapook Bay on  
the north side of Casapook River in y<sup>e</sup> County aforesaid begin=  
=ing at a marked white oak upon Grays End Brook & run=  
=ing for breadth from y<sup>e</sup> oak west north west unto  
Casapook Bay by a line of Division being part of a line  
two Acres called as aforesaid and that part being divided into  
two halves or moieties according to y<sup>e</sup> division aforesaid  
& laid out for one hundred & fifty Acres of Land being more  
or less as by a certain Deed Between Samuel Wheeler of y<sup>e</sup>  
and y<sup>e</sup> Richard Mazon of y<sup>e</sup> other pt & recorded in Kent  
County Records may more fully appear as also the Deed  
of one hundred and fifty Acres of Land by a Deed  
by a Deed from y<sup>e</sup> Wheeler unto Thomas Blacklock &  
from y<sup>e</sup> Blacklock unto y<sup>e</sup> Benjamin Blacklock as  
by y<sup>e</sup> Deeds may more at large appear relation being
