

This Indenture made y^e 23rd day of march in
the year of our Lord Christ (1693) & in y^e fifth year
of y^e Reign of W^m & Mary by y^e grace of God of
England & Betwene Benjamin & W^m Parrot both
of y^e County of Salter County in y^e province of Maryland
planters & Elizabeth y^e wife of Benjamin Parrot
of y^e one part: And Philip Hopkins of y^e county
& province aforesaid of other part Witnesseth
that y^e Benjamin & W^m Parrot for y^e better
consideration of y^e sum of fourteen thousand pounds
of good sound merchantable gold & easte paid or
well & sufficiently undertaken & secured so to receive
unto y^e Benjamin & W^m Parrot by y^e Philip
Hopkins & divers other good causes & considerations
thun y^e Benjamin & W^m shewunt especially
moving they y^e Benjamin & W^m Parrot by y^e
the consent of Elizabeth y^e wife of Benjamin
Parrot resigned to her & being & sealing their seals
made given granted bargained sold & conveyed & assign
& transferred by their & without doer for themselves & their
heirs & assigns & executors & administrators & assigns
all y^e conditions unto y^e Philip Hopkins
with y^e intent to have half of that tract of land
called the Meadows formerly owned to Thomas
Jackson by agreement from y^e Parrot & Philip Hopkins
unto y^e Francis Jackson assigned to y^e Parrot by
y^e Parrot & Hopkins by indenture dated y^e 17th day of June
1694) which tract of land y^e Philip Hopkins
agreed to give Parrot y^e son of James Parrot
the said Philip Hopkins Parrot did with a consent
of his last will & testament unto his sons George &
Benjamin that thousand acres of land called the Meadows
