special instance and request of him the said John Blackston  
would lend to him the said Blackston a certain horse of his  
the said John for him the said Blackston to ride a small Journey  
upon the said horse from the house of the said Bright to the  
Horsing gutt and the said John Blackston did Assure upon him-  
self and unto him the said John Power did then and there kitch  
day Guard and stand aforesaid faithfully promise that he the  
said John Blackston in the Journey aforesaid would in no man-  
ner overload or anywise oppress but the said horse who he  
would be the more required to him the said John Power would  
specially observe and he the said John Power in fact saith that  
he trusting to the aforesaid promise and Assumption of the afore-  
said John Blackston afterwards to wit 7 day Guard and stand  
aforesaid did lend the aforesaid John Blackston the horse aforesaid  
to ride and Journey upon the said horse as aforesaid & that the  
John Blackston did so far provoke over labor and with such burden  
overload that the horse died and so the aforesaid John Blackston  
promise & Assumption hath not performed or fulfilled to the damage
