Know all Men that John Lewis otherwise called John Lewis of Kent County Gaylor standeth attached to Answer unto Thomas Coursoy of the aforesaid County Ex: of the last will and Testament of Coll: Henry Coursoy of a plea of Debt &c

Whereupon the said Thomas Coursoy by Grestish Jones his Att: complaineth and saith that whereupon the said John Lewis within the Jurisdiction of this Court stood justly indebted to the said Henry Coursoy the full and just sum of five hundred and fifty pounds of Tobacco in cash at and intire paynt as by his obligation herin Court produced may more at large appears bearing date in yere Anno 1694 yett the aforesaid John Lewis the aforesaid demanded the aforesaid sum of five hundred and fifty pounds of Tobacco to the said Henry Coursoy in his life, this hath not paid or to the sd Thomas in his capacity after the death of the aforesaid Henry Coursoy hath not rendered but the same to render hath denied and will deny and unjustly obtained whereupon his faith he is damaged and hath damages to the value of Eleven hundred pounds of Tobacco and thereupon he bringeth his suit
