attached to Answer unto John Gore of Bithyford  
in England Merchant of a plea for: upon the case

Whereupon the said John Gore by Griffith Court his Attorney  
complains that the said Ford within the Jurisdiction of  
this Court had justly indebted to the said Gore for several goods  
and Merchandise bought and delivered to him ~~the~~ said Ford to the  
value of One pound sixteen shillings of Sterling money of  
England being the Ball: of seven pound six shillings & four  
pence by his acc. dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of April and May 28<sup>th</sup> Anno  
1696 and here in Court produced many more at large app<sup>ar</sup>ances  
which said sum of monie altho<sup>th</sup> often demanded by the said  
Gore yett the said Ford little regarding but plotting & contriving  
and fraudulently intending to deprive him the said Gore  
of the aforesaid sum of One pound sixteen <sup>shillings</sup> he hath not  
paid but hath not to pay but wholly refused and denied to  
the damage of him the said Gore two pound & twelve shillings  
& four pence and thereupon he brought his suit

And the Defend<sup>t</sup> producing an Answer by the said Gore in

of England as also the sum of two hundred & twenty five  
pounds of Tobacco of cost of suit
