The Jury being sworn and the above Jury being duly sworn
 to try the same the presentment against it read and the matter
 therein contained appeared by Homfroy on the behalfs of our
 Sovereign Lord the King Richard Mason and Wm Comogus being
 sworn as Evidence on his Majesty's behalfs and the Jury having
 heard the whole matter on both sides the Court giving them
 their charge who withdrew themselves to consider on the same
 for and returned again with this following verdict viz
 That the Jury do find John Hodger guilty of forcible
 Entry and detainer and that he John Hodger by Griffith
 Gents his Attorney moves in Arrest of Judgment

It is therefore ordered by this Court that Judgment be
 do and that the Reasons therein offered be filed according to
 rule of Court for filing declaratory
