At which Court being on the 24th day of November last day of the return of the writ aforesaid right Capt: Edward Broadbent Sheriff of said County and made return of the said writ in these following words viz: Copie of Mr: Broadbent Sheriff

John Knott Defendant: Gent: Lord of Galbot County planter was summoned to answer to John Baudon of London Merchant of a place that he render him the full and just sum of two thousand four hundred pounds and six pounds of good sound and every way well conditioned tobacco in rags which he furnished and sent from him his subject Dabbineth

And considering the said John Baudon by William Harris Esq: his Attorney saith that whereas the said John Knott on the 14th day of March anno Domini 1686 in said County within the jurisdiction of this Court by his certain bill or bill of exchange obligatory sealed with his hand as his Act and dated delivered and had in Court brought before date in his hands day and year did bind himself to his Honor the R: Adm^r: to pay or cause to be paid unto the said John Baudon the sum of 2436 of tobacco quicke fied as aforesaid remonant in Chichester River after before the 10th day of October then next ensuing the date of the said Bill $\frac{4}{5}$ per cent Notwithstanding the said John Knott the sum of 2436 pounds of tobacco according to the sum of the said bill unto the said John Baudon he hath not paid altho often demanded and the same to pay the same desired and refused to the damage of the said John Baudon four thousand pounds of tobacco and thenceforth bring this suit
