And whereupon the said Thomas by William Howslop his Attornd
complains that whereas the said William in his life time viz
on the 15th day of March Anno Domini 1643 in said County within
the jurisdiction of this Court justly indebted unto the said H^{is}
Thomas the full and just sum of Seven hundred and H^{is}
thirty pound of of 200. In consideration thereof the said Wm
in his life time upon himself assumed and to the said
Thomas faithfully promised that he the said William the
said sum of 730 of Tobacco unto the said Thomas should
well and truly pay when therunto required Yet notwithstanding
the said Wm in his life time the said sum of 730 of Tobacco
according to his promise and assumption aforesaid unto the
Thomas he did not pay nor the said Sarah when led and north
said Stephon and Sarah in their respective times their inter-
marriage and since the death of the said William nor any of
them they have the same not paid all the often required but
the same to pay he hath denied and refused to the damage
of the said Thomas in value hundred pound of of Tobacco &
thereupon he brings this suit

And the said Stephon Whatston in his proper person comes and prays
liberty thereof to have parole until next Court which is granted & they set
And now at this day came the said Thomas by Wm Howslop his Att^r
and the said Stephon in his proper person but making no reasonable
objection to the said judgement is awarded for the sum
of Six hundred and sixty pound of of Tobacco and cost of
suit
