And the said Thomas Collins by Robert Smith Esq: conjoyned to
Court and the said Robert Smith bearing Speciall Bail for the
said Thomas Collins in the aforesaid County by the said Thomas
by John Fairies as aforesaid and pronounced to this Court that the
said Thomas shall pay the summe of two hundred
