the particulars by the Bill of cost signed by the Clerk of y^e said
Court is here in Court brought yet notwithstanding y^e sd Thomas
the sd sum of 1658¹/₂ of Tobacco the halfe of the charges in the
sd Provincial Court by the said John on his part in the sd Accion ex-
pended according to the test of the said bill unto the sd Mr. Chauncy
he hath not paid altho often demanded but the same to pay he hath
denied and refused to the damage of the sd Mr. Chauncy three thousand &
10 poundes of Tobacco and thereupon he brings this bill
