

And Now here at this day the sd Wm True neither by himself nor  
 by his attorney showing any reasonable cause why the sd True should  
 not give <sup>up</sup> the Estate of him the sd John True  
 Therefore it is considered by this Court that the sd Charles Gildon  
 have Execution of the Estate of him the sd John True for the  
 amount sum of three hundred and two pounds of Tobacco &  
 according to the sd former Judgement as also for the sum of One  
 hundred twenty and six pounds of Tobacco cost of suit

Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County y<sup>th</sup> 28 day of H  
 Jun: Anno Dom: 1696 that he levy by Way of Execution of the  
 goods Chattels &c: of Henry Hosier if they should be found in his  
 Bailiwick to the value of Honor twelve forty and eight pounds  
 of Tobacco to satisfy unto Charles Gildon a certain Debt and cost  
 recovered at him the said Henry by him the sd Charles at a  
 Court hold for sd County the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November last W<sup>ch</sup>  
 same when carried to have before his Mas<sup>ty</sup> Justice at y<sup>e</sup> West Court  
 to &c:

At which Court viz: y<sup>e</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> day of March Anno Dom: 1696  
 of returne of sd Writ came Capt: Edward Swatman High Sheriff  
 of sd County and made returne of the sd Writ in those Words  
 viz: I have Executed of the goods and Chattels of the within Henry  
 Hosier One Tild of Tob: cont: Neat four hundred fifty and two  
 pounds for the within Charles Gildon as by within Writ Gain &  
 Commanded of Edw: Swatman the ff

Therefore it is considered by this Court that y<sup>e</sup> above One Tild  
 of Tobacco Executed as aforesaid and containing four hundred &  
 fifty and two pounds of Tobacco Neat be condemned for the  
 use of the sd Charles Gildon
