

Therefore it is considered by this Court that the Defend: John Hues doo. Records from the Pet John Hawkins as worth the sum of fifty poundes of Tobacco for a Non suit as also the sum of One hundred and Seventy poundes of Tobacco of suit

Command was given to the Sherif of Kent County the 28th day of Jan^y Anno Dom 1696 to take John Hues if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him safe keepe so that he have his Body to send his Ma^{ty} Justices at the next Court to answer unto John Hawkins of a plea of Trespass upon the case

At which Court viz: the 23th day of March Anno Dom 1696 the day of Return of D^y Witt returns Capt Edward Brodrick the High Sherif of said County and made Return of D^y Witt in these words viz: Copi of ind^{em} Brodrick the ff

And the said John Hues on the day aforesaid in his proper person appeared and prayed thereof to Impare until next Court which was granted the same day is given to the Pet likewise, which said Action being continued from Court to Court until this present day

And Now here at this day viz: the 25th day of August came as well the said Pet John Hawkins as also the Defend: by William Homfroy his Attorney &c:

John Hues Defd: } Kent J: John Hues of Kent County Planter was attached to answer John Hawkins of a plea viz: upon the case

And whereupon the said John Hawkins by Samuel Withers his Att^y complains that whereas the said John Hues the 25th day of Feb^r Anno Dom 1694 at Droghda River within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his certain writing subscribed with his hand as his Act and deed delivered and bore into Court brought whose date is the same day and year aforesaid he did promise to pay to the said John Hawkins by the order of One John Selter the sum of Two hundred and Seventy seven poundes Tobacco and in consideration thereof the said John Hues upon himselfe assumed and to the said John Hawkins faithfully promised
