sum of 1200 of Tobacco qualified as aforesd journey in Way
Rise to the sd paym: well and truly to be made and do: he the sd
James did bind himself his Heir Ex: and Ad: in the penal
sum of two thousand four hundred pounds of like Tobacco
as aforesd to be paid as aforesd Yet notwithstanding the sd James
the sd sum of 1200 of Tobacco according to the Bill of the said
Bill unto the sd Thomas he hath not paid but the same to pay he hath
denied and refused to his damage of the sd Thomas two thousand four
hundred pounds of Tobacco and thereupon he brings this suit
