did return and being called over as aforesaid the said Jury
did say that the Jury find for the Defendant and so they
said all / Jurors: concurring to verdict of the Jury

Therefore it is considered by this Court that the Defendant
James Beard do recover from the Pet Philip Wapley
as well the sum of fifty pounds of Gold for his late
damour as also the sum of six hundred forty and two
pounds of Gold cost of suit

Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County the 3rd day
of February Anno Dom 1697 that he take Robert Darnley if he
should be found in his Bailiwick and him safe keep so that he
have his body before his Majesty's Justices at the next Court to An-
swer unto Richard Wallis of a plea of trespass upon the case

At which Court viz: the 29th day of April: Anno Dom 1698 the
day of return of said writ came Capt. Edward Sweetnam High
Sheriff of Kent County and made return of said writ in these words
viz: Capt. Edw. Sweetnam Sheriff

On which day the said Robert Darnley by Richard Markes his
attorney appeared and prayed that he might be committed until his next Court:
was granted the same day is given to the Pet likewise
