## 1801. NOVEMBER. LAWS OF MARYLAND.

CHAP.

Proprietors to

receive one

dollar, &c.

LIV. And, whereas the justices of the levy court of Baltimore county, in virtue of the powers vested in them by an act, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, passed at November session, seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, have contracted with James Calhoun for the erection of an additional warehouse for the inspection of tobacco in the city of Baltimore, Be it enacted. That the proprietor or proprietors of the said warehouse, when erected, shall receive at the rate of one dollar on each hogshead of tobacco therein inspected, as a compensation for the expence of erecting and keeping in repair said warehouse, and in lieu of rent, to be paid before such hogshead be removed, and for any tobacco that may remain in the said warehouse more than one year, the further sum of twelve and an half cents per month thereafter for each and every hogshead so remaining.

Justices to recommend persons, &c. LV. And BE IT ENACTED, That the justices of the levy court of said county, or a majority of them, shall, when the said warehouse is erected and fit to receive tobacco, nominate and recommend to the governor and council three or five persons, in their discretion, of whom the governor, with the advice of the council, if three persons are nominated, shall appoint and commission one, and if five persons are nominated, two, to be inspector or inspectors of said warehouse, in the manner directed by this act, and the said levy court shall ascertain his or their salaries, and provide weights and scales at the expence of the proprietor or proprietors aforesaid; and that the said warehouse, when so erected, shall be in all respects under the same regulations as other warehouses in Baltimore county, except the building and keeping the same in repair, which shall be done at the expence of the proprietor or proprietors.

Inspectors to

LVI. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the inspector or inspectors appointed for the said warehouse shall, every three months, account for all monies received by him or them for storage of tobacco as aforesaid, and pay the same to the proprietor or proprietors of the said warehouse.

Acts repealed.

LVII. AND BE IT ENACTED, That an act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of to-bacco, passed at November session, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine, and the several supplements thereto, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Duration.

LVIII. This act to continue until the thirtieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and five, and until the end of the next session of assembly which shall happen thereafter.

C H A P. LXIV.

Passed 31st of Dec. 1801.

A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, and to establish and regulate a market in said town.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the memorial of the commissioners of the town of Cambridge, that they have contracted with William Bond Martin for a part of Market street, in the said town, and have received from him the purchase money agreed to be paid for the same, and it is prayed that an act may pass confirming the said sale and the title of the said William Bond Martin to the part of the said lot so purchased by him: And whereas the said commissioners have also prayed for such a reasonable extension of their powers as will enable them more effectually to accomplish and promote the due regulation and improvement of the said town; therefore,

Sale confirmed,

II. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the said sale so made as aforesaid by the commissioners of the town of Cambridge to William Bond Martin, of a part of Marketstreet, in the said town, be and the same is hereby confirmed and made valid, and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby authorised and empowered to make a deed to the said William Bond Martin for the parcel of ground so sold to him according to the terms of their contract, which deed shall be good and effectual to vest in the said William Bond Martin a good legal title to the said parcel of ground, according to the tenor thereof.

Commissioners to levy a tax, &c. III. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners of the said town shall have power and authority to assess and levy an annual tax of fifty cents for every dog, and the sum of one dollar for every bitch, belonging to any of the inhabitants of the said town, and the said commissioners shall direct the respective taxes to be collected by the bailiff of the said town from the owner of

such
