AUTHORIZING and directing the Attorney General of Maryland and his assistants to examine the Annotated Code of Maryland and report the sections and articles of said Code which are obsolete and useless and ought to be repealed.

WHEREAS, a new edition of the Annotated Code of Maryland is to be issued after the 1924 session of the General Assembly of Maryland, including the laws enacted at said session; and

WHEREAS, there are numerous sections and articles of said Code which are obsolete and useless; and

WHEREAS, all such obsolete and useless sections and articles should be eliminated before the new edition of the Code is issued, therefore

*Be it resolved by both Houses of the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Attorney General and his assistants be and they are hereby authorized and directed to examine the present Annotated Code and the laws enacted since its publication, and to report to the General Assembly of Maryland at the next regular session in January 1924, the sections and articles which are obsolete and useless and should be repealed; and

*Be it further resolved,* That at the time of submitting said report, the Attorney General shall submit the necessary bills for repealing the obsolete and useless sections and articles contained in said report.
