Withheas the days for such new general registration are fixed by taw, and can only be changed by the General Assembly of Maryland; and

WHEREAS because of exceptional and unforseen circumstances it will be impossible for a large number of the citizens of Baltimore to register on any one of the registration days so fixed by law, and for that reason an occasion exists which requires a special or extraordinary session of the General Assembly of Maryland.

Now, Therefore, I, Albert C. Ritchie, Governor of Maryland, by virtue of the authority conferred and duly imposed upon me by the Constitution, do hereby call a special or extraordinary session of the General Assembly of Maryland to consider and act upon measures necessary to remedy the situation aforesaid, said session to begin at twelve o'clock noon, eastern standard time, on Tuesday, the twenty-ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and thirty, at the State Capitol, in the City of Annapolis.

GOVERNOR RITCHIE'S STATEMENT CALLING AN EXTRA SESSION OF THE LEGISLATURE FOR TUESDAY, JULY 29, 1930, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING NEW GENERAL REGISTRA-TION DAYS FOR BALTIMORE CITY.

I have decided to call an extra session of the Legislature as the only means of enabling a large group of our citizens to retain their
