The Jurors for the Right Honourable the Lord properly that now is for the body of Kent County upon their Oath do present that George Harrington of St Pauls Parish in the County of Labourer Servant to George Copper the tenth day of February Anno Domini Seventeen hundred twenty and nine with force and Arms at the Parish in the County and within the Jurisdiction of this Court one Mare of a Grey colour of the price of three hundred pounds of Tobacco of the goods and Chattels of a certain Robert Dunn then and there being found therein feloniously did steal take and carry away contrary to the peace of the said Lord properly that now is his good Rule and Governm against the form of the act of Assembly in such latter made and provided
Jest Will Copper Francis God free

All the back of the preceding Indenture a Indenture was made as follows a true bill of God's Peace for ever

And the said George Harrington in his proper person was there and saith that he is in no sort guilty of the premises above upon him imposed as by the said Indenture it is alleged and thereof he putteth himself upon the Country Geo Harrington in pp of John

And he who follows for the Lord properly in like manner saith he is equally

And now here Notice being standing the plea of the same George Harrington comes into Court and with draw his plea and in his proper person comes and saith that he cannot answer the Indenture of so as of against him brought nor that he is guilty of the premises upon him imposed as by the said Indenture it is alleged and thereupon submits to the Court. Therefore it is considered

the Justices here to wit at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in March being the seventeenth day of said Month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and twenty and nine that the said George Harrington stand in the pillory for the space of an hour and afterward receive at the public whipping post four on his bare back five lashes till the blood appear as a punishment for his said Crime of Felony according to the force form and effect of his Confession and also it is considered that the said George Harrington pay the sum of three pound current money it being that part the Court adjudges you to pay of the four fold of the said Goods stolen being half and also the sum of three hundred and thirty pound of Tobacco of the price of the premises and to the officers of this Court

It is also considered by the Court here to wit the same day and year last mentioned that the Sheriff of Kent County take the said George Harrington into his custody and execute the punishment the Judgment and sentence and afterward to bring him into Court again of which for the said Sheriff to wit Joseph Young Gent High Sheriff of Kent County make return on the day and year last said that he hath executed the said Judgment and also hath here the said George Harrington before the Court
