Nicholas Keyley George Skil John Tucke Henry Trulock Tho Hatcher John Benja Griffith who being duly elected and sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the said Robert Anderson is not guilty of committing the same base born Child as is alleged and do say they find him guilty of Fornication and by James Thomas therefore manna all to say. Therefore it is considered by the Justice here to wit at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third day of June being the sixteenth day of said month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty That the said Robert Anderson pay the sum of thirty Shillings for money as a fine for committing the offence of Fornication according to the force and effect of the Verdict of the Jurors aforesaid and also pay the sum of two hundred and Ninety pence of Tobacco Cost accruing on the premises as to the Officers of this Court

ordered by the Court here that the said fine be immediately paid and thereupon comes into Court Mr James Calder and saith he will pay the same to James Smith.
