the same John and contrary to the peace of the said Lord Proprietor that now is his good
Rule and Government &c

John James Muggold Junr. Volund Muggold John Sellard
on the back of the same bill was endorsed a true bill by the said Justice for man
and the said William Cooper in his proper person comes and saith that he
is in no sort guilty of the premises above upon him imposed as by the said

Indictm^t it is alleged and thereof he putteth himself upon the Country
and he who followeth for the said property in like manner shall be in
guilty

and now here at this Court to wit the twentieth day of June Anno Dⁿⁱ 1730
to wit hundred and thirty came the said William Cooper and saith that he
standing his plea of his comes and will draw the same and saith
that he cannot gainway the Indictm^t of so as against him brought
nor that he is guilty of the premises above upon him imposed as by the
said Indictm^t it is alleged and thereupon submits to the Court therefore

it is considered by the Justice here to wit the same day last mentioned
that the said William Cooper pay the sum of five Shill. Sterd money
to the use of his said Lord Ship as a fine for committing the assaults
and also pay the sum of two hundred fifty eight p^{ts} of Tobacco
Cost according to the premises and to the officers of this Court &c

ordered by the Court here that the said William Cooper give security for
the said fine & fees and thereupon comes into Court John James Muggold
County and saith that he will pay the said sum of five Shillings the
fine and the Cost thereupon according to the same William doth not
pay it himself

The said W^m at last came on to recognize with security for his ap^{er}
to this Court to answer the said Indictm^t &c and now the said W^m Cooper
in his proper person appears to the same ordered by the Court
here
