 that now is for the body of Kent County and upon their oath do
 present that Patrick Carvack late of St. Pauls Parish in
 the County and labourer the twentieth day of October Anno Domini 1730
 took and carried away with force and arms at the parish
 of St. Pauls in the County and within the jurisdiction of this Court one Shit of the value of forty pds
 of Tobacco of the goods and Chattels of a certain William Clarke then and there being
 found then and there solemnly did steal take and bear away contrary to the peace of
 the said Lord Proprietor that now is his good rule and Government and against the form
 of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made and provided Francis Goddard
 Test John Haseley Rachel Clarke

AND the said Patrick Carvack in his proper person comes and saith that he is in no sort
 guilty of the premises above upon him imposed as by the said Indictment it is alleged
 there is no truth therein upon the Country Patrick Carvack in sh^r person
 AND he who follows for the Lord Proprietor in like manner saith he is guilty
 Francis Goddard in sh^r person

There up on Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County that he immediately
 cause to come here to be indicted by whom he will he will order to be indicted because as
 was said off which said Sheriff the said Sheriff to wit Joseph Young Gent now here at this
 day to wit the sixteenth day of June Anno Domini 1730 hundred and thirty makes
 return that he hath here ready to be indicted as by his precept he was commanded and
 here afterwards to wit the day before last mentioned came against the said Lord Proprietor
 being impeached and called likewise came to wit James Thomas Charles Smith Jr Esq
 William and Jane Jordonia Lovington James Giggott jun^r Nath^l Joyloy Geo Hill John Tucker
 Henry Trulock Thomas Hatcher for the said Carvack who being duly elected by and sworn
 to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say Patrick Carvack is guilty of the
 felony of Stealing the above Shit as the said Indictment and by James Thomas therefore
 all so say. Therefore it is considered by the Justices here to wit at the Court House in the
 Town of Christ^{ch} in said County on the third Tuesday in June Anno Domini 1730 hundred and
 thirty that the said Patrick Carvack stand in the pillory for the space of one quarter of an
 hour and afterwards he to receive at the publick whipping post eight Lashes on his bare
 back till the blood appear as a punishment for the said Crime of felony according to the
 form and effect of the Ordinance and also pay the sum of eighty pounds of Tobacco
 it being for the four fold of the goods so as aforesaid stolen as also pay the sum of eleven
 hundred eighty nine pounds of Tobacco lost accruing on the premises and to the officers of
 this Court
