That the Sheriff of Kent County take the said Patrick Carwack and execute the punishment in the Judgment and afterwards to bring him into Court againe off which said precept the Sheriff of said County to wit Joseph Young Gent High Sheriff of Kent County makes return on the day and Year last mentioned that he hath executed the punishment in the Judgment and also that here the said Pat Carwack before the Court

ordered by the Court here that Joseph Young Gent High Sheriff of said County being present in Court keep the said Patrick Carwack in Custody until the fees and shall be satisfied

Rachel Clarke being an Examinant in the said Cause being sworn in Court saith that she attended the Court in the said Cause six days as an Exor. ordered by the Court here that the said Patrick pay unto the said Rachel the sume of one hundred and eighty p^{ts} for her Attendance as aforesaid

At this Trial the Jurors for the right Hon. the Lord Proprietarie that now is for the body of Kent County and upon their Oath do present that Patrick Carwack late of S. Pauls Parish in the County of Planteur the twentieth day of October Anno Domini Seventeen hundred twenty and three with force and Armour at the parish aforesaid within the jurisdiction of this Court and Sheriff of the value of forty pounds of Tobacco of the goods and Chattels of a certain Charles Baker then and there being found there and there feloniously did steal take and bear away contrary to the force of the said Lord Proprietaries that now is his good rule and Government and against the force of the Act of Assembly in such Case lately made and provided *Wherewith* God punish

Test Rachel Clarke on the back of the preceding Indenture was and as told by Bell and Crappins the Hyson foreman and the said Patrick Carwack in his proper person came and saith that he is in no sort guilty of the premises above upon him imposed as by the said Indenture it is alleged and that of no fault or forfeiture upon the Country. Pat Carwack In p^{se} of son and he who followeth for the Lord Proprietarie in like manner saith he is guilty *Wherewith* God punish

Wherewith Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County that he immediately cease to come and take twelve shillings who neither do to Acquaintance because as well he. By whom do. Off which said precept the said Sheriff to wit Joseph Young Gent now here at this day to wit the Saturday day of June Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty came and made return thereto that he had here ready w^{ch} as by his precept he was Commaunded And now here afterwards to wit the Sunday and Year last mentioned came againe as well his Deedship by his ally and as the said Patrick in his proper person and the Jurors of that Jury being Impanelled and called likewise came to wit James Thomas Charles Smith John Cooper W. Chaim Doane Jers. Livingston James Fuggate jun. Mule Hoyley George Still John Tucker Henry Trulock Tho. Hattonson & Thomas Hubbard who being duly elected tryd and sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the said Patrick Carwack is guilty of the felony wherewith he stands Indented and by Jurors Thomas therefor men all so say. Wherewith is considered by the Justice here to wit at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Wednesday in June being the Twentieth day of said Month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty that the said Patrick Carwack stand in the Pillory for the space of one quarter of an hour and then to be rowed at the publick whipping post eight lashes well laid on his bare back till the blood appeare as a punishment for the Crime aforesaid of Com. *Smith*
