levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lord Ship his  
Honor and Successors Conditionally that if the said Mary Tobey shall not make her selfe personal  
appearance at the next Court to be held for said County on the third Tuesday in August then

be held for said County on the third Tuesday in August next to give evid<sup>ce</sup> as his said Lord Ship behalfe
