 Court on the third Tuesday of March next then and there to answer & stand &

 Suspicion of being guilty of a breach of an Act of Assembly of this Province  
 in Warrying out of the same and in the mean while to be of good behavi-  
 our that thou this Recognizance to be void otherwise to stand in full  
 force & Virtue Taken and Acknowledged the day & date as above before  
 Tho Shipp

And now here at this Court to wit on the third Tuesday in March being the  
 sixteenth day of said Month Anno Domini 1730 came the afo Charles  
 in his proper person and appeared to the afo Recognizance and  
 prayed he might be therefrom Discharged ORDERED by the Court  
 here that the same Recognizance be dish. Therefore the  
 same Recognizance is by this Court there dish there being no  
 cause to the contrary Shown &c
