Day of April one Thousand Seven Hundred thirty one Henry Shewit personally appeared before me the Subscriber one of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace for said County Henry Shewit & acknowledged himself indebted unto the Right Honble the Exchequer his heirs and Successors in the Sum of Five pounds Sterling money of Great Brittain to be Levied on his Lands and Tenements goods and Chattels Conditionally if he do not make his personal appearance at the next Court to be held for the said County and in the mean time to be of good behav. wherewith he is contented.

At which time came Saml Groom of said County & likewise acknowledged himself unto the said Lord Ship his heirs and Successors in the Sum of Five pounds Sterling to be Levied as afo Conditionally that the said Henry Shewit do not make his personal appearance as afo & wherewith he is contented

At which time came likewise John Ingh of said County and likewise acknowledged himself indebted unto the said Lord Ship his heirs and Successors in the Sum of twenty pounds Sterling to be Levied as afo Conditionally if he do not make his appearance at the next Court to be held for the County afo then and there to prosecute Henry Shewit as Suspition of Felony wherewith he is contented

As also came Roger Hoare of said County and acknowledged himself indebted unto the said Lord Ship in the Sum of Five pounds Sterling money to be Levied as afo Conditionally if he do not make his personal appearance at the next Court to be held for the County afo as an Evidence against the afo Henry Shewit wherewith he is contented
