He immediately cause to come two Wobles &c. by whom &c. who neither &c. to
 recognize &c. because as well &c. of which said precept the said Sheriff to wit.
 Joseph Young Gent now here at this day to wit the third Tuesday in June being
 the fifteenth day of said Month Anno Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and
 thirty one makes return that he hath here ready Wobles &c. as by his precept
 he was Comanded and now here afterwards to wit the day and Year last next:
 and came againe the said the Deputy by James Francis Esq. Clerk of the
 Indentments and Philip Carrol in his proper person and the Jurors of that Jury
 being Impannelled and Called likewise came to wit Robert Dunn Benjamin
 Griffith Philip Davis John James John William John Downing John Hunt Thom
 Mafsey William Simcocks Christopher Bollican Saml Jacey and John Browning
 who being duly Vouched tryed and Sworn to say the truth in the premises upon
 their Oath do say Philip Carrol is guilty of the fornication &c. as by the
 said Indentment is alledged and by Robert Dunn their foreman all so say
 Therefore it is considered by the Justices here to wit at the Court
 House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in June
 being the fifteenth day of said Month Anno Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and thirty
 one that the said Philip Carrol pay the Sum of Six hundred pounds of Ta
 it being a fine &c. for committing the fornication &c. (according to the verdict of
 the Jurors &c.) and also pay the Sum of Thirteen hundred Eighty three
 pounds of Tobacco Costs accruing on the premises &c. to the officer of this
 Court &c. ordered by the Court here that Security be given for
 the fine &c. Thereupon came into Court Roger Hicket
 of the same County Blacksmith and Saith he will pay the fine
 &c. for the said Philip Carrol amounting to the Sum of
 Nineteen hundred and eighty three pounds of Tobacco and
 thereupon the same Philip is therefrom discharged &c.

Margret Falconer being an lodger against the said Philip Carrol
 comes into Court and being sworn Saith that she attended this Court
 three days as an lodger in the Cause this day ag^t the said Philip
 ordered by the Court here that the said Philip pay the Sum of
 Ninety pounds of Tobacco for to the said Margret Falconer for
 her attendance as aforesaid &c.
