Recd Morymly & Memorandum that Joseph Francis Gentle Attorney of the Right
Honble the Lord Proptry that now is for the County and who for the same Lord
Proptry in this part presenteth doth come into the County Court of the said -
Lord Proptry held for Kent County and at Chelten Town in the same County before
William Frisby Esq^r and his associate Sir said Lord Proptry Justices of the same
Court to wit on the 25th day of March anno Dom 1730 hundred
& thirty and for the same Lord Proptry doth give the same Justices here to -
understand and be informed that William Tidmarsh late of Chelten Town in
St. Pauls Parish in the County aforesaid holder the tenth day of February in
the year aforesaid at Chelten Town aforesaid together with William Moods late of the same
Parish and County Tinker by their writing Obligatory with their Seals sealed
and as there Act & Deed delivered did become bound unto Joseph Young -
Sheriff of the same County in the first and last sum of eight thousand pounds
of Tobacco to be paid unto the same Joseph in Eq^r Adm^r or Assign to whom
payment well and truly to be made the said William Tidmarsh and William
Moods did bind themselves here their day and Adm^r jointly & severally -
genuinely by the same writing obligatory and the aforesaid Attorney of the said Lord
Proptry doth give the same Justices here further to understand and be -
informed that the aforesaid William Tidmarsh afterward to wit the same tenth
day of February the promfer well knowing at Chelten Town aforesaid within
the Jurisdiction of this Court minded and fraudulently intending herein
the said Joseph in that frank craftily & Subtily to deserve & defraud
and to cause the said writing obligatory to be of no force & effect falsly -
unlawfully Subtily & deceitfully the writing obligatory aforesaid into the hands
& possession of him the same William with force & arms did obtain &
then and there with force & arms falsly unlawfully & voluntarily -
unjustly & fraudulently & deceitfully without the license
& against the will of the said Joseph the same writing obligatory did
soe lacerate & mangle to the great detit & prejudice of the said Joseph
and against the peace of the same Lord Proptry the good rule and -
government wherefore the same Attorney of the said Lord Proptry for
the same Lord Proptry prayeth the advice of the Court here in this place
and doth protest of law against the same William to issue to -
answer unto the same Lord Proptry of and upon the premises ab-
