Ordered by the Court here that the same William Tidmarsh again enter into Recognizance for his appearance any time during the Courts sitting to wit the 10th and thereupon the same William Tidmarsh in his proper person comes into Court and acknowledged himself indebted to his said King in the Sum of Two hundred Sterling to be paid to his said King his heirs and Successors to be made and secured on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements conditionally that if he shall not make his personal appearance any time during this Courts sitting to answer unto Information on a complaint of the said Christian Cully and to be of good behavior whereunto he acknowledged himself bound

and now here afterwards came the said William Tidmarsh again and in his proper person appeared to the said Recognizance and prayed he might be discharged from the same ordered by the Court here that the same Recognizance be discharged as prayed Thereupon the same Recognizance is by this Court here discharged there being no cause shown to the contrary
