

Know all men that it is remembered that on the 3^d of April Anno 1731 came Thomas
 Alford before me the Subferior (one of the right Hon^{ble} the Lord High Justices

 High Court to be held for this County at Westor Tower on the fifteenth
 day of June next to give evidence on behalf of the said Lord High Justice
 against Roger Fuzzen on suspicion of felony then the above Recognizance
 to be void else to remain in full force *Frederick Harrison*

And now here at this Court to wit the fifteenth day of June Anno Domini one
 Thousand Seven Hundred and thirty one came the aforesaid Thomas Alford and in
 his proper person ordered by the Court here that the same Recognizance
 be discharged. Whereupon the same Recognizance of the aforesaid Thomas Alford be
 discharged

Know all men that the Jurors for the Right Honourable the Lord High
 Justice for the Body of Kent County aforesaid upon their Oath do present
 that Roger Fuzzen late of St. Pauls Parish in the County aforesaid the Servant
 of William Shupper the tenth day of May Anno Domini Seventeen hundred
 thirty one with force and Arms at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid
 within the Jurisdiction of this Court two Horses of hand worth of the
 value of eighty pounds of value of the goods and Chattels of a certain
 Thomas Alford then and there being found there and there did feloniously did
 steal take and carry away contrary to the peace of the said Lord
 Justice that now is his good rule and Government and against the
 form of the act of assembly in such case lately made and
 provided *Frederick Harrison*
