Master John Ingh of said County who is supposed to have altered the marks of a hogg then this recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in full force taken before me one of the Lord's Justices for Kent County Geo. Sherwell.

And now here at this Court to wit on the thirtieth day of August Anno Domini 1731 one hundred and thirty one came the said William Thompson and in his proper person appeared and ordered by the Court here that the said Philip Rafter — recognizance for his appearance be defiled ^{thereupon} the said recognizance is by this Court here defiled &c. ordered by the Court here that Surety be given for the appearance of the said William Thompson to the next Court &c.

And thereupon came Matthew Howard of the said County and acknowledged himself indebted to the Right Hon. the Lord's Justices in the sum of ten pounds Sterling to be paid to his said Lord Ship his heirs and Successors to be levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the said William Thompson shall not appear at the next Court to be held for said County on the third Tuesday in November next to testify on his Lord Ship's behalf against the said John Ingh and the said Matthew Howard ^{the} Acknowledges himself content

ordered by the Court here that the said John Ingh enter into recognizance with Surety for his appearance at next Court to answer the said Indictments

The said John Ingh came into Court and in his proper person acknowledged himself indebted to the Right Hon. the Lord's Justices in the sum of forty pounds Sterling to be paid to his said Lord Ship his heirs and Successors to be made & levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he do not make his personal appearance at the next Court to be held for said County on the third Tuesday in November next then and there to answer unto what shall be objected against him on his Lord Ship's behalf on Account of an Indictment found against him for feloniously altering the marks of a hogg and in the mean time to be of good behaviour wherewith he acknowledges himself to be therewith content

and also at the same time came Philip Bernard Junr and James Calber of Kent County Gentlemen and in their proper persons acknowledged themselves indebted to the Right Hon. the Lord's Justices in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling to be paid to his said Lord Ship his heirs and Successors and to be made and levied on their and either of their Body's Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the said John Ingh shall not app^r and answer unto the said Indictment at the next Court to be held at our Court House in the Town of Chertsey in said County on the third Tuesday in November next and in the mean time
