 : ker having appeared his recognizance his Surety's recog-
 : nizance be discharged -

Walker Treeston of Kent County Labourer at the day and
 year ap^d before the ap^d M^r. John Evans and M^r. George Shroven
 acknowledged himself Indebted unto the Lord prop^r of this
 Province of Maryland in the sum of fifty pounds Sterling
 money of great Brittain to be made and Satisfied & Condi-
 : tionally that if he should not make his personal appearance
 before the Justices of this Court to answer unto what shall be
 objected against him on suspicion of Intended Murder & if
 that in the mean time he should not be of good behaviour -
 and now at this Court to wit the 20th day of August Anno Dom^o
 Secenteen hundred twenty eight the ap^d Walker having
 appeared his recognizance is discharged &c.

Daniel Perkins of Kent County Millwright & James
 Smith of the ap^d County Gent. before the ap^d John Evans
 and George Shroven acknowledged themselves Indebted
 unto the Lord prop^r of this Province of Maryland in the sum
 of twenty five pounds Sterling money each to be made and
 Satisfied & Conditionally that if he should not make his
 personal appearance before the Justices of this
 Court to answer unto what shall be objected against
 him on suspicion of Intended Murder & if that in the
 mean time he should not be of good behaviour & now at this
 Court to wit the twentieth day of August Anno Dom^o 1728
 the ap^d Walker Treeston having appeared the said
 Dan^l Perkins James Smith their recognizance is discharged
