Keating and John Gleaves all of Kent County in Maryland personally acknowledged themselves indebted unto the Right Hon. the Lord prop<sup>r</sup> of Maryland his heirs & Successors viz. the sd Joseph Mann the sum of ten pounds Sterling. & the sd John Keating & John Gleaves five pounds like money due to be levied of their bodies goods & Chattels Land &c. Conditionally if the sd Joseph Mann doth not make his personall appearance before the Justice of his L<sup>ds</sup> Court to be held at Chester Town in Kent County the third Tuesday in Nov. next then and there to give Evidence in behalf of his Lordship against a certain William Chorom who is alledged to have whipp'd and beat a certain Matthias Day of said County &c. Then this Recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in full force Taken before us one of the R. Hon. the Lord prop<sup>r</sup>s Justice for Kent County J. Skirven
