 Sterling money of Great Brittain to be Levied on his Goods and Chattels  
 Lands & Tenements Conditionally if he do not appear at the next Court to  
 be held for the said County and in the mean time to be of good behav<sup>r</sup>  
 wherewith he is contented At which time came Philip Gassin  
 and Thomas Habin of said County and acknowledged themselves  
 indebted into his said Lordship his heirs and Successors in the Sum  
 of five pounds Sterling each to be Levied as aforesaid Conditionally  
 that if the said Edward Dowling doe not make his personall  
 appearance as aforesaid to answer unto such things as he shall be charged  
 with touching the begetting of a Child on the Body of Martha  
 Tippet of Shrewsbury Parish in said County whereat they  
 acknowledge themselves levouled taken before me R. H. W. D.  
 and now here at the said third Tuesday in March being the twenty  
 first day of said Month Anno Domini Seventeen Hundred and thirty one  
 came the said Edward Dowling and in his proper person appeared  
 to the aforesaid Recognizance and prayd that the same and his Sureties might  
 be discharged ordered by the Court here that the same Recognizance  
 be discharged as prayd Edward Dowling his recognizance taken as aforesaid  
 are
