Person Acknowledges themselves Indebted unto the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this Province of Maryland in the sum of fifty pounds Sterling money each to be made and Served &c. Conditionally that if she should not make her personal app<sup>er</sup> before the Just<sup>ice</sup> of the then next Nov<sup>er</sup> Court to answer unto what shall be Objected against her on his Lordship's behalf & on suspicion of Intended Murder & in the mean time if she should not be of good behaviour wherewith the said Peter Massey & Samuell Gooding & either of them Acknowledges themselves content -

It is Ordained }  
 The said Sus. having Intended into recogni-  
 fice }  
 at last Court for her appearance at this  
 Court to answer unto what shall be Objected  
 against her on his Lordship's behalf and  
 now at this Court the said Sus. having appeared Ordered  
 that her recogniz<sup>ance</sup> and her surety recogniz<sup>ance</sup> be Discharged  
 John Ashley and John Sturges both of West County planters  
 at last Court did Acknowledge themselves Indebted unto  
 the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> of this Province of Maryland in the sum of  
 ten pounds Sterling money of great Brittain to be made  
 & Served &c. Conditionally that if the said Sus. should  
 not make her personal appearance before the  
 Justice of the then next Court to be held for West County  
 to answer unto what shall be Objected against her  
 on his Lordship's behalf & if that in the mean time she  
 should not be of good behaviour and now here at this day  
 to wit the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> 1728 the day of
