And now at this Court to wit on the third Tuesday in March being the twenty first day of said Month the said David Cole and in his proper person appeared and prayed that he might be discharged from his said recognizance as also his Security's recognizance for his appearance Ordered by the Court here that the same recognizance and the Surety's be discharged This Court here discharged the said David Cole's recognizance there being no cause shown to the contrary also David Ford's recognizance for the said David Cole's appearance &c. is by this Court here discharged &c
