And the said Edward Harris in his proper person cometh and saith that he cannot gainsay the Judgment and so as against him brought nor can he say but that he is guilty of the premises as above by the Judgment and is forth and thereupon submits to the Court therefore it is considered by the Justices here to wit at a Court hold for the County of Kent at the Court House in the Town of Rochester in said County on the third Tuesday in March being the twenty first day of said Month Anno Domini 1731 that the said Edward Harris pay the sum of two hundred pounds of Tobacco to the right Honourable the Lord High Steward as a fine for committing the assault and in form mentioned that the said Edward Harris pay the sum of three hundred ninety six pounds of Tobacco cost and charges accrued on the premises to the Officers of this Court

ordered by the Court here that Joseph Young Esq. High Sheriff of said County keep the said Edward Harris in custody until the fine and fees are satisfied &c.
